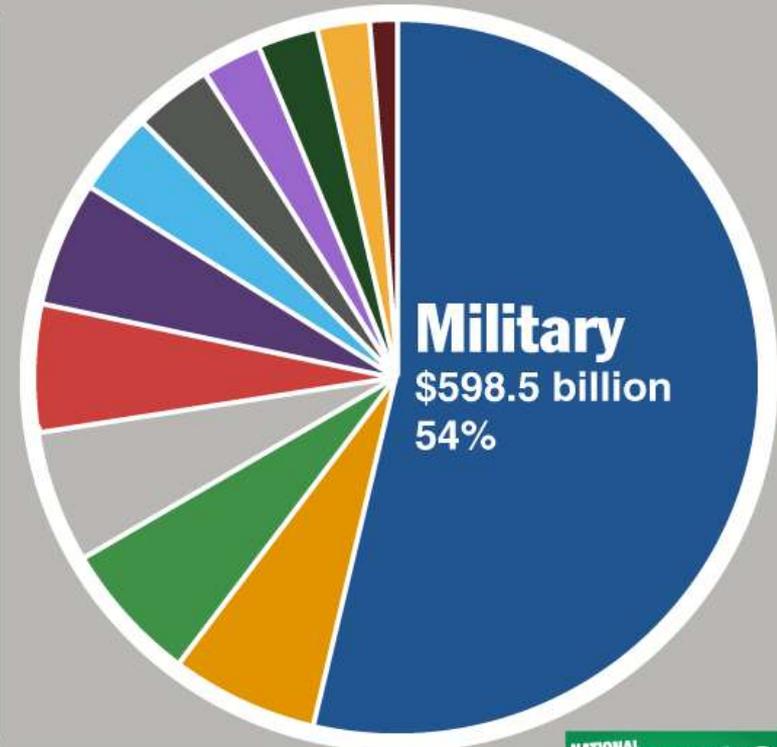

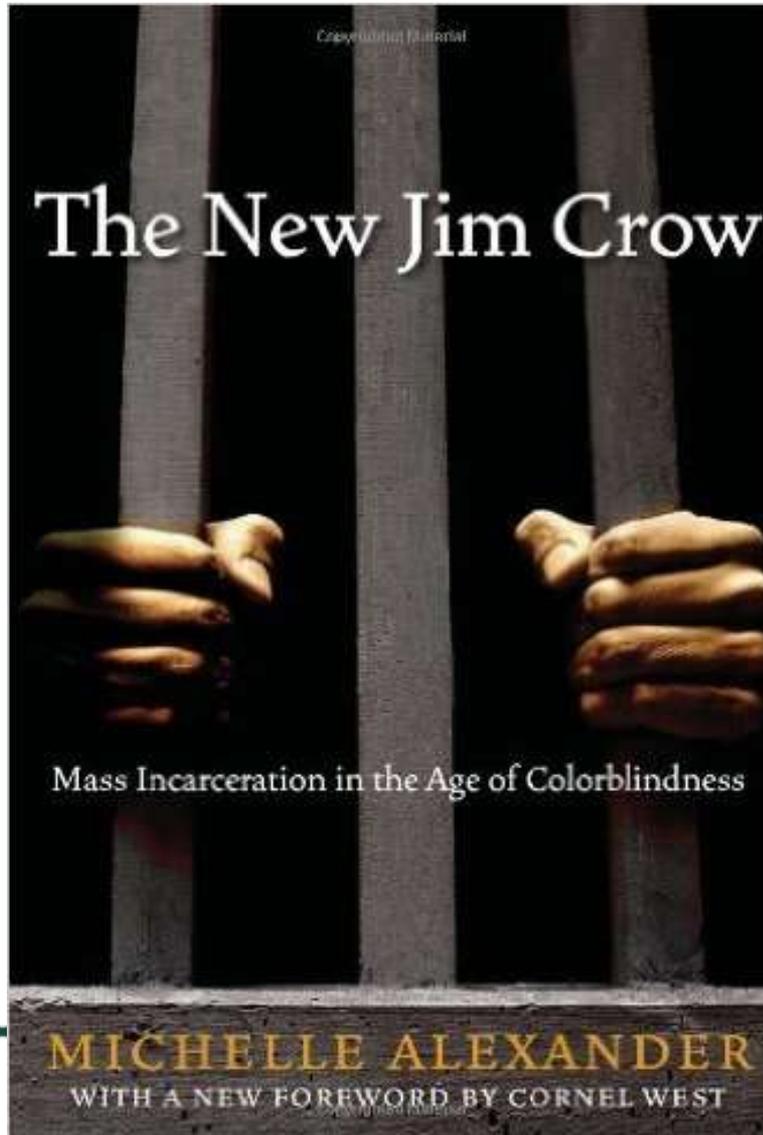
Top 1% share of income, %
